Mission

Establish and maintain a comprehensive infrastructure for integrated, accurate, and actionable data to support children, families, and communities in South Carolina.

Vision

We will be successful when all children reach their highest potential.

Goals

- 1. Create standard definitions and reports for evidence-based decision making.
- 2. Achieve equity by supporting stakeholders in identifying and resolving disparities.
- 3. Inform policies and practices to support children, families, and communities.
- 4. Connect early childhood data into longitudinal data systems.
- 5. Understand the impacts of investment from Birth through Workforce.
- 6. Improve the quality of life for all South Carolinians.

RE: Report from the Interagency Collaboration Committee

The Interagency Collaboration Committee (ICC) held its regular bimonthly meeting on May 4, 2021. Four guests attended the meeting. Peggy Ball and Chad Dorn presented an overview and update of the Preschool Development Grant (PDG). Bill Potapchuk, Commutivi Building Institute, and Mary Beth Salomone Testa, MBT Solutions, solicited specific feedback for the Birth through Five Plan. They asked for feedback regarding the mental health needs of young children and their families.

Key staff involved with the early childhood needs assessment, state data collection and management, PDG activities, and Birth through FivePlan are meeting regularly to coordinate work and activities. An unduplicated count of children engaged with early childhood programs was identified as a project of interest. During the most recent meeting of this collaborative group, staff from Research, Evaluation, and Measurement Cente(REM) reported that this spring, *Early Childhood Education Journal* accepted an article about the findings of the 2019 Early Childhood Needs assessment, "Identifying the Needs of Prekindergarten Children: A Focus on Health, Wellbeing, and Family Environment."

The ICC receives a regular update from the SC Early Learning Extension of the of thetatewide Longitudinal Data System. A Data Governance Work Group is meeting twice a monthto establish a set of key questions, and then determine what data is being collected to help answer those questions. Recommendations will be presented to the South Carolina Early Childhood Advisory Council (ECAC) The Work Group is collecting feedback from various stakeholders and end-users to ensure that key questions match stakeholders' interests and needs.

The ICC will not meet in July. This meeting will be rescheduled for August 3, and the ICC will review and discuss progress to date on the Birth through Five Plan.

Call to Order and Welcome

Georgia Mjartan convened the meeting.

Preschool Development Grant

Peggy Ball and Chad Dorn presented an overview of the Preschool Development Grant. The showcased the collaboration among early childhood providers.

ICC members will be asked to

- Help distribute a survey which will be used to update the PDG Needs Assessment
- Provide information for the Annual Performance Progress Report relating to numbers of children and families served, as well as expenditures made on behalf of those children and families

Building South Carolina's Birth through Five Plan

Bill Potapchuk, Community Building Institute, and Mary Beth Salomone Testa, MBT Solutions, solicited specific feedback regarding the mental health needs of young children and their families. Increased access to care in rural areas, home visiting that includes mental health supports, increasing the number of mental health providers, and enhanced training for professionals to address mental health issues in schools and child care centers were listed and discussed by ICC participants.

First 5 SC

Tom Lacas and Jessica Garrett, 37 Gears, provided an overview of First Five SC. Through a single online portal, families and their advocates can find information about child care, health, early intervention, nutrition, and parenting support programs in their area. First Five SC engages parents and caregivers as active partners in making South Carolina's early childhood system work for young children and families. By streamlining the search and application process, First Five SC helps families better understand their options and choose the programs and services that best meet their needs.

ICC members will be asked to

Meet with 37 Gears for in-depth conversations about the site.

SC Early Learning Extension

Justina Siuba, Data Governance Coordinator, provided an update of the SC Early Learning Extension (SCELE), of the Statewide Longitudinal Data System. The work of the SCELE is to improve outcomes for young children and their families through an aligned system for data-informed decisions and policies. Siuba presented a draft set of questions of interest that the SCELE should be able to answer. Questions included

- What are the characteristics and where are the vulnerable and underserved children and families?
 - Including a specific focus on rural areas in SC, minority communities, undocumented families
- Who and where are the children being served and those awaiting services? (unduplicated counts and waitlists)
- Are South Carolina's children, starting at birth, on track to succeed?
- Are they ready for kindergarten/demonstrate readiness in multiple domains?
 ICC members are encouraged to contact Siuba with questions or feedback and additional questions.

Cross-sector Collaboration and Updates

The Commission on Higher Education is putting in place a plan to increase equity in higher education and reduce gaps in achievement and learning.

Head Start will be presenting a Census report to the Education Oversite Committee at the Statehouse. The report is done twice a year (December and June) and will now include numbers on foster and homeless children.

ETV has launched Donkey Hodie, an educational show with puppets. SCETV is assisting with data casting for educational content to rural areas.

The Department of Mental Health working to expand its access to services into rural areas.

Children's Trust of SC recently held a webinar announcing the <u>SC Home Visiting Needs Assessment Update 2020</u>. The organization will be moving to more outreach and creating a network of home visiting programs.

The Department of Disabilities and Special Needs reported that SC was one of the few states that served more children during the pandemic. The department is working more in rural areas.

The Department of Health and Human Services has a new director who is still learning about the agencies many services. BabyNet also saw growth in numbers.

The Department of Social Services (SC DSS) is continuing to approve vouchers as part of COVID relief. Child care centers will soon be able to apply for a fourth round of provider grants. SC DSS will host a public hearing June 7 as part of its preparation of the State Plan for the Child Care Development Block Grant.

SC First Steps was joined by DSS Director Mike Leach to present to the Early Childhood Study Committee on interagency collaboration and its responsiveness. The two agencies will be launch First Steps 4K + Siblings. The program will provide siblings of First Steps 4K students a scholarship to attend child care or after school care for 52 weeks.

The ECAC will host an in-person Summit on Early Childhood on December 2. A number of featured speakers have been secured.

Grants

- 1. Alliance for Early Success Grant

 - b. Grant increased from \$25,000 to \$50,000
- 2. Preschool Development Grant
 - a. Year 1 Annual Report submitted end of April
 - b. Plans for Year 2 include working on a fiscal map of the early childhood landscape
 - i. Map will include PDG funded programs and other programs that contribute to well-being of young children and their families
 - c. Staff involved with needs assessment, evaluation, data collection and strategic planning are now meeting regularly with ECAC strategic planning facilitators to coordinate work and activities
